

Pre-Anesthetic Blood Screen

Rest assured, advances in anesthesia and surgery have made routine procedures relatively safe, with a low risk of complications. However, since anesthesia and surgery are not without risk, the American College of Veterinary Anesthesiology states that all animals should have a pre-surgical blood screening. The pre-anesthetic blood screen will help the doctor better access liver, kidney, and heart function. This is important in the doctor's selection of an anesthetic protocol that is safest for your pet.

Intravenous Catheter and Fluids

Administering intravenous (IV) fluids during anesthesia maintains blood pressure and increases circulation. IV fluids are also used to administer medications and help the patient recover more quickly.
